General Guidelines for Carts

- Keep cart lids completely closed. Do not overload. A cart with an open lid may not be emptied. If the cart is not emptied you will be responsible for taking your waste to the Ponass Lake Waste Management Site Transfer Station where you will pay a per bag charge to dispose of your garbage OR to any Saskatchewan Environment permitted landfill.
- Place your cart out, wheels to the curb, before 7 AM on collection day. Place it as close as possible to the delivery spot. If there is someone else's car parked in that spot, place it 4 feet from the car in line with the delivery spot. The carts will be placed on the street in front of your premise for a majority of residential customers. Commercial customers will have varying cart locations.
- If you park on the street take care to leave room for cart service on Wednesdays!
- Return the cart to your yard by the end of the collection day, once it is emptied. DO NOT leave it on the street. Remember you are responsible for damage to the cart and will be charged for a replacement cart if it is damaged, vandalized or stolen.
- Do not remove your cart from the assigned address.
- Do not paint or mark your cart.
- Inform the Town office of any damage, vandalism or theft of your cart.
- Do not allow children to play in or near the carts or the Loraas collection trucks.

Garbage (Grey Cart) Guidelines

- Solid non hazardous household garbage, food and bagged yard waste are acceptable in the BLACK cart. **Bag your garbage and place it in the BLACK cart.** Do not put liquid in either cart for removal. You may use any type of garbage bag including recycled grocery bags. Putting items that rot in strong whole garbage bags would be a good idea. Garbage is picked up every 2nd week which can lead to odour in the summer. You are responsible for washing out your cart if it becomes unsanitary.
- Items placed outside the cart will not be picked up.
- Do not place any of the prohibited items in the carts. Placing prohibited items in the carts will result in an upcharge for the service and the cost of service will go up.

Prohibited Items are: Hazardous waste, medical waste, pressure fill containers, paint, used oil, oil filters or containers, electronics.

Recycling (Blue Cart) Guidelines

- Recyclable materials should be clean (no food or dirt residue) and put loose in the blue cart to aid processing at the automated recycling facility.
- DO NOT place black plastics or black garbage bags in the recycle carts. Black garbage bags will be treated as contamination waste and may result in a greater cost for the entire load.
- Council cannot force you to recycle. If you are a low volume waste producer whose garbage easily fits in the black waste cart for the 2 week pickup cycle OR if you want to pay to deliver waste at the Transfer Station per their bagged garbage cost this is your choice **BUT there will be no reduction on the service cost per month even if you do not use the recycle cart.**
- Council encourages you to recycle. Diversion of waste from landfills is a major priority for Saskatchewan Environment and municipal support of recycling leaves options open for the future of waste management in our region.

Refundable deposit containers may be

- recycled at SARCAN
- OR DONATED TO THE FIRE DEPARTMENT (Drop off at the Fire Department can shed next to the RM Office)
- OR placed in your Loraas blue cart these include aluminum/tin beverage cans, plastic beverage bottles (pop, juice), glass beverage bottles (wine, spirit, beer) juice boxes and cartons and milk containers.

Nonrefundable recyclables that are accepted by Loraas include (all items must be clean)

- Beverage containers (aluminum, plastic, tetrapak) and glass wine, spirit, and beer bottles – rinse and deposit loose;
- Metal (please rinse clean) aluminum cans, trays, pie plates and foil; household tin cans (food, beverage, soup).
- Plastics (please rinse and remove lids): all household plastics with any recycling symbol from 1 to 7



- Paper – newprint flyers, junk mail, envelopes, letter quality paper, copier paper, computer printout, shredded paper (in CLEAR plastic bags tied shut), non metallic gift wrap, magazines, catalogues, paperback books, telephone books, hardcover books (cover and spine removed), tissue and paper towel cores, flattened cardboard and paper board boxes.
- DO NOT put waxed, plasticized or food contaminated paper, soiled tissues, napkins, paper towels, confetti paper or heavily dyed or coloured construction paper in recycling – these items are WASTE (garbage).

- NOT ACCEPTED items include hangers, scrap metal, tanks, autoparts, batteries, hazardous chemical containers.
- NOT ACCEPTED plastics include styrofoam, plastic toys, Tupperware, plastic pipe, outdoor lawn furniture, containers without the recycling symbol, used oil containers or biohazardous materials

SOLID WASTE REMOVAL PROHIBITED ITEMS:

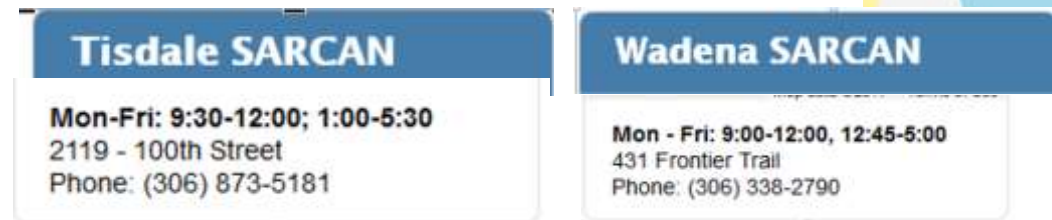
PLEASE DO NOT DEPOSIT THESE ITEMS IN THE WASTE OR RECYCLING CARTS / BINS OR THE CLEAN WOOD PILE. DISPOSAL OF THESE ITEMS IN THE WASTE STREAM WILL RESULT IN UPCHARGES FROM LORAAS AND INCREASED SERVICE CHARGES TO YOU THE RATEPAYER.

PUTTING ANYTHING BUT CLEAN WOOD IN THE CLEAN WOOD PILE AT THE TRANSFER STATION WILL RESULT IN FAILED ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING TESTS, FINES FROM SASK ENVIRONMENT, SITE SHUT DOWN AND INCREASED TAX CHARGES TO YOU THE RATEPAYER.

1.0 ELECTRONICS PROHIBITED

HOW DO I DISPOSE OF WASTE ELECTRONICS? RECYCLE WITH SARCAN

Qualifying electronic devices can be dropped off at any one of SARCAN's 71 depots including



Once they have been dropped off for recycling, they are shipped to approved North American processors for dismantling. The various components are then recycled. Through a variety of refining and smelting processes, material reclaimed from end of life electronics such as metals, plastics, and glass, are used as raw materials in the manufacturing of new products.

Computers, Monitors and Accessories: laptops, tablets, CPUs (towers), desktop servers, CRT monitors, flat panel monitors and automotive displays as well as keyboards, mice, speakers, external modems/routers, external drives, and scanners.

Desktop Printers and Fax Machines: Inkjet printers, laser/toner printers, dot matrix printers, all-in-one (multi-function) printers, photo printers, label printers, and desktop photocopiers.

Televisions, including CRT and flat panel televisions, closed-circuit displays, and TV/VCR or DVD combinations.

Audio Equipment, including stereos (home and automobile), speakers (home, automobile, and MP3 docking speakers), headphones, microphones, portable music players (CD, cassette, MP3), voice recorders, radios, alarm clock radios, and turntables.

Video Equipment, including VCRs, DVD players, portable DVD players, personal video recorders (PVRs), satellite receivers, cable receivers, personal data assistants (PDAs), and digital picture frames.

Cameras, including film cameras, digital cameras, video cameras, web cameras, and security cameras.

Telephones, including corded and cordless telephones, cellular and smart phones, satellite telephones, VOIP telephones, pagers, beepers, and answering machines.

What is not accepted?

We reserve the right to reject any electronics if we deem them to be in an unsafe condition to handle (including those with broken shards of leaded glass or excessively dirty products).

2.0 PAINT AND PAINT CONTAINERS PROHIBITED

HOW DO I DISPOSE OF PAINT, PAINT CONTAINERS AND AEROSOL PAINT CONTAINERS?

RECYCLE



Customers may bring in paint containers ranging in size from 100 ml to 23 litres, empty or containing paint, and aerosol paint containers to any one of the 71 SARCAN Recycling depots across the province, which act as paint collection sites for the Saskatchewan Paint Recycling Program. SARCAN also maintains shelves for reuse if paint is potential usable, which is available for the public free of charge.

The Saskatchewan Paint Recycling Program (SPRP) started in 2006 with the creation of the Ministry of Environment's Waste Paint Management Regulations to manage paint products such as household paints, stains, and varnishes.

Daily limits for paint drop off apply: 25 one-gallon paint containers and up to 50 aerosol paint containers. Trade painters and other bulk paint customers may drop off more than this by appointment only.

3.0 TIRES PROHIBITED

If you have rimless car and truck scrap tires check out the Saskatchewan Scrap Tire Corporation Return 2 Retailer program which allows free delivery of such tires at www.scraptire.sk.ca. The program has a limit of 10 tires but you can arrange more with the retailer if they want to accept delivery. Retailers in Wadena and Tisdale accept tires under these programs. Phone the retailer for details or check out the FAQ for the program under the website's Recycle tab.

4.0 ENGINE OIL, ENGINE OIL FILTERS, ENGINE OIL CONTAINERS, ANTIFREEZE CONTAINERS, DIESEL EXHAUST FLUID CONTAINERS PROHIBITED TO ANY LANDFILL OR TRANSFER STATION

Used oil is considered the single most potentially hazardous material in Canada if not managed properly. Used antifreeze is toxic; dumping it can cause serious water quality problems. Disposal of these items to landfills is prohibited.

5.0 PROPANE BOTTLES AND PRESSURIZED CONTAINERS PROHIBITED

The Central Regional Landfill (Wadena and area landfill) takes propane bottles from non-members. A large number of retailers will take used propane bottles when you purchase a new bottle from them.
